Consistency is everything! Use this tracker to log your watering dates, feeding schedules, and plant observations. This simple habit will help you spot patterns, adjust your care routine, and watch your plants THRIVE. Plus, you'll have a record to reference next season!

How to Use This Tracker

- **Log faithfully:** Record water and feeding immediately — don't rely on memory!
- **Be specific:** Note soil condition (dry, moist, soggy) and how much water you gave.
- **Watch patterns:** Over time, you'll see when your plant prefers water and when it needs feeding.
- **Adjust:** Use your notes to fine-tune your watering schedule next season.

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QUICK REFERENCE GUIDE

Watering Guidelines

Light Watering:

Top inch of soil moist. For leafy greens & herbs.

Full Watering:

Soil moist throughout. Standard for most veggies.

Deep Watering:

Soak until water drains from bottom. For established plants.

Soil Check:

Stick finger 2 inches into soil. That's your best guide!

Pro Tip: Build Your Garden Memory

After a few weeks, you'll have your plant's watering/feeding rhythm mapped out. This is GOLD. Save these notes! Next season, you'll reference them and skip months of trial-and-error. You'll also spot what works best for each plant, so you can grow them even better next year. That's how gardeners get better — by paying attention and learning from their own garden!
